NEW BUSINESS

REINARD AND FOUGHT SEASONAL MAINTENANCE TECHNICIANS CONTINUED EMPLOYMENT

Stoudt noted that the planned end dates of the seasonal employment of Craig Reinard and Doug Fought is October 31, 2021. However, Stoudt noted that MARC had allowed itself the option to continue employment as part-time, hourly employees beyond this date if it chose to do so. Stoudt praised the work of Reinard and Fought and requested approval to transition both Reinard and Fought to Maintenance Technicians at their current compensation rates (\$17.00/hr).

2022 LAWN CARE INVITATION TO BID

Stoudt called the group's attention to MARC's 2022 Lawn Care Invitation to Bid package as distributed with the meeting agenda packet. Stoudt noted that the Washingtonville Borough line items will be reviewed separately by Washingtonville Borough Council and may or may not be awarded separately at the discretion of Washingtonville Borough Council. Stoudt also called the group's attention to the addition of herbicide treatments of the Hess Recreation Area infields. If approved, the cost of these herbicide treatments would be reimbursed by the Danville Lady Railers organization.

PIRMA FORGERY / FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE INSURANCE

Stoudt presented additional information regarding the proposed purchase of Forgery / Faithful Performance Insurance through PIRMA as presented on pages 49 and 50 of the meeting agenda packet. Stoudt reported that he did not believe the purchase would be of significant benefit to MARC for the proposed \$700/year cost and recommended against the purchase.

No action was taken.

WASHINGTONVILLE BOROUGH HEALING THE PLANET GRANT ADMINISTRATION

Stoudt and Chairman Dombroski explained that Washingtonville Borough had received a \$10,000 grant from Giant's Healing the Planet grant program. Washingtonville Borough is asking that MARC hold the grant funds and administer the grant on the borough's behalf. Stoudt recommends MARC do so as part of MARC's efforts to support the ongoing Washingtonville Revitalization efforts.
