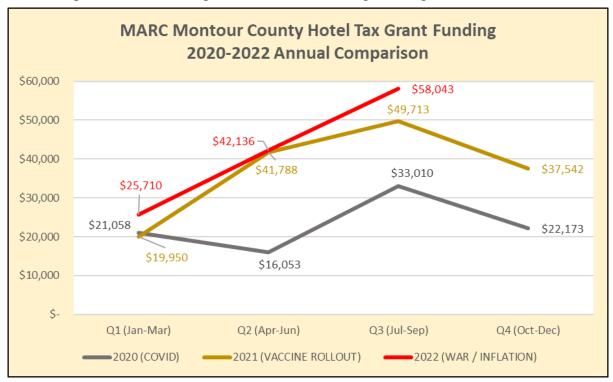




GRANTS

Montour County Hotel Tax

- o MARC on 11/11/22 received and deposited \$58,043.31 in Q3 Montour County Hotel Tax funds
 - All funds were used to offset previously incurred eligible expenses; no Montour County Hotel Tax funds remain earmarked in MARC's accounts
- o In total, MARC received \$163,433.15 in Montour County Hotel Tax grant funds during calendar year 2022, exceeding budget projections of \$130,000 and slightly exceeding the anticipated 'normal year' benchmark of \$160,000
- MARC anticipates receipt of the Q4 2022 Montour County Hotel Tax grant funds in mid-February 2023
- Stoudt will submit to the Montour County Commissioners the required annual request for funding renewal and will go before the Columbia Montour Visitors Bureau in January to provide the required annual update on MARC's operations and Hotel Tax grant usage

- DCNR 2020 Non-Motorized Trails Grant Danville Borough Levee North Branch Canal Trail Construction (administered by Danville Borough) (no updates since last meeting)
 - Danville Borough staff continue working to identify final trail alignments and secure final agreements for affected properties
 - o Project construction will not begin until 2023 at the earliest
 - o project mapping is available at https://www.google.com/maps/d/edit?mid=17se2PMghOEBzg70bdSTOg3HPCTTO9drE&usp=sharing
- Mahoning Township American Rescue Plan Grant (no updates since last meeting)
 - MARC on 12/13/21 was awarded \$25,000 in American Rescue Act grant funding from Mahoning Township
 - o Funds are to be used to offset the negative economic impact of COVID-19 on MARC's operations and to be focused on projects of importance to Mahoning Township residents
 - o MARC on 12/30/21 expended \$9,305 to pay Kleinfelder for engineering work for the Hess Loop Trail (J. Manley Robbins Trail) at the Hess Recreation Area
 - \$15,704.98 (with earned interest) remains earmarked in a dedicated checking account to pay a
 portion of the costs for the planned engineering, permitting, and design work for the Hopewell Park
 Pump Track
- DCNR 2021 Park Rehabilitation and Development Grant (Hopewell Park Pump Track) (no updates since last meeting)
 - MARC was notified on 12/30/21 that its application to DCNR for \$125,000 in grant funding to rehabilitate Hopewell Park had been conditionally approved
 - Project activities will include expanding and improving parking, improving site drainage, creating bicycle skills features, reconstructing the existing earthen beginner-level pump track and jumps area, creating a new asphalt-paved pump track, and adding new universally-accessible parking and access features
 - As of 11/17/22, MARC has so far secured \$168,489.15 in pledges and donations to match the DCNR grant
 - As recently authorized by MARC's Board, all necessary documentation has been provided to DCNR to allow the redesignation of grant funds from MARC to Montour County to satisfy DCNR's requirements
 - An updated grant agreement has been provided to Montour County, allowing work to proceed once final questions are resolved
 - Stoudt on 3/31/22 met with DCNR, Montour County, Brinkash & Associates, and Kleinfelder to discuss grant terms and conditions and to prepare for project engineering and permitting
 - As of 11/17/22, Stoudt must again consult with DCNR regarding engineering requirements for pump track design before work can begin

- o Signage for the 2022/2023 hunting season trail closures were posted on 9/23/22

 - Additional signage will be posted at trailheads before the start of firearms season
- o MARC will work with an Eagle Scout candidate or do work in-house to create a concrete pad to properly secure the new bike rack recently constructed and donated by Kris Huber and Nick Craven
- Work is ongoing to prepare for the planned pump track construction and related redevelopment activities as reported elsewhere in this meeting packet

Montour Township (Columbia County) Legion Road parcel

No concerns noted since last meeting

• River Drive parcel (North Branch Canal Trail trailhead and river access)

- o Stoudt continues to monitor ongoing property encroachments by an adjacent landowner
- o MARC staff will work in early 2023 to fell / remove dead trees and limbs on the property

• North Branch Canal Trail (no updates since last meeting)

- o Land Stewards Wayne Kashner and Jennifer Hunsinger continue to maintain the trail
- Land Steward Wayne Kashner continues work to realign portions of the trail near the Catawissa Boat Club to avoid chronically wet areas
- o Montour County and the SEDA-COG Joint Rail Authority have resumed legal action against the owner of the Bear Hunters' Grove Campground to resolve the years-long property ownership dispute
 - Stoudt has been in communication with MARC's legal counsel regarding proposed next steps for legal action and anticipates legal proceedings will be ongoing through the winter
 - MARC will continue to enforce the trail closure through the disputed lands between trail miles 3.5 4.2; no MARC staff or volunteers will enter the disputed lands until the matter is resolved
- Stoudt will contact the Columbia County Conservation District to determine permitting requirements to install a new culvert at trail mile 5.4 (culvert was permitted under NPDES permit, but not installed) (no change since last meeting)
- Stoudt will consult with the Montour County Conservation District to consider options to improve the ford crossing at trail mile 2.72 (no change since last meeting)
 - It is recommended that MARC rebuild the crossing with R6 rock and a log cross-vane to provide better long-term stability for the crossing
 - Stoudt will investigate costs and schedule the work when funding and staff availability allow



MANAGED SITES (continued)

Hess Recreation Area

- o MARC staff worked on 10/21/22 and again on 11/10/22 to fill road / parking lot potholes
 - Stoudt does not anticipate additional road work in 2022, but anticipates significant repairs will be required in spring 2023
- o MARC staff worked on 11/10/22 to regrade sections of the Robbins Trail (Hess Loop Trail), removing the construction fencing along the areas of concern near trail miles 1.3 1.5
 - Stoudt has noticed no significant changes in the area in recent months and found the fencing and posts to be in poor condition; an adequately wide trail has been created around the areas to allow safe usage
 - Stoudt and volunteers will continue to monitor the location on an ongoing basis
 - Stoudt has consulted with Elijah Evans regarding anticipated costs to properly repair the failing sections of the trail (*no change since last meeting*)
 - Cost estimates (~\$40,000) far exceed MARC's current financial ability to do the necessary work
 - Stoudt and Brehm will consider options for future grant funding and other alternatives
- One road culvert pipe remains significantly blocked from repeated storm erosion; Stoudt has reached out to Danville area contacts for assistance (no change since last meeting; work must wait until volunteer schedules allow)
- O Stoudt and Shevchenko have completed most design work for the new J. Manley Robbins Trail interpretive sign for installation at the Beaver Place Trailhead (*no change since last meeting*)
 - Final details are yet to be completed, but funding does not yet allow for fabrication and installation of the planned signage (~\$1,500)
- o Stoudt has consulted with R.C. Young, Inc. regarding probable costs to repair the park access road
 - The recommendation (in 2021) had been to clean existing potholes and install asphalt repairs, then furnish and install two coats of tar and chip at an estimated cost of \$45,000 \$50,000 (assuming a road length of 3,600ft and width of 16ft)
 - Stoudt notes that cost estimates were secured before the recent dramatic increase in oil and fuel prices
 - Additionally, the road has continued to deteriorate significantly in 2022
 - Stoudt now believes a partial fix is no longer viable and anticipates a full milling and resurfacing of the roadway will likely cost approximately \$100,000
 - Stoudt will continue to seek funding to allow this high-priority project to be completed, but notes that it will be exceedingly difficult for MARC to secure the anticipated 50% grant match (~\$50,000)
 - Additionally, Stoudt believes the project will be ineligible for DCNR grant programs because the road reconstruction was DCNR grant funded in 2011
- o The Hess Recreation Area Field Usage and Maintenance Agreement between MARC and the Danville Lady Railers, with Danville Borough consent, has expired (*no change since last meeting*)
- Stoudt on 2/13/22 met with the 4H Outdoor Explorers group to discuss a project to update the tree identification markers, mapping, and brochure for the Hess Recreation Area
 - Stoudt hopes to complete the project this winter (no update since last meeting)
- o In consultation with MARC's staff and after researching local comparable sites, Stoudt has reviewed and updated the Hess Recreation Area usage application form and fee structure for the 2023 season
 - The pavilion reservation fee has been increased from \$25 for four hours to \$25 for two hours
 - Sports field fees have been increased from \$75/day to \$150/day; season-long fees have also been adjusted; Note: fees were last updated in 2016
 - The updated form and fee structure is available at https://montourrec.com/schedule-a-field/

Montour Preserve

- The Environmental Education Center was used as the Anthony Township polling location for the 11/8/22 election
 - No problems or concerns were observed
- MARC has received one estimate to provide and install electrical surge protection for the Visitors' Center / Environmental Education Center building
 - MARC is awaiting one more proposal for services
 - As of 11/17/22, Stoudt does not believe MARC will be able to afford the project during the 2023 budget period, but has significant concerns about delaying the project
- o MARC's staff on 10/26 and 10/27//22 shut down the Goose Cove and Heron Cove Picnic Area water systems
- o MARC's staff on 11/2/22 moved the fishing pier and boat dock to winter storage
 - MARC's staff found the boat dock to be in need of repair and moved it to the boat house area
 - Stoudt believes the dock to be at the end of its useful life and is investigating options for replacement, but MARC's 2023 budget is inadequate to allow the necessary replacement
- Pipeline construction work through the Preserve is paused indefinitely because of wet conditions and winter temperatures
 - Stoudt anticipates closures of portions of several trails will remain in effect through early spring, including the Goose Woods Trail (partial), Wildlife Management Trail (partial), and the Chilisuagi Trail (between the Goose Cove Picnic Area and the Ridgefield Point Loop Trail)
 - The Goose Cove #2 pavilion will remain closed to all use until spring 2023
 - Contractors have made significant efforts to minimize disruptions to visitors to the Montour Preserve and have worked to partially restore access to the sugar shack area for planned February 2023 maple sugaring programming
- MARC is working with Eagle Scout candidate Sam Roup to install new fish habitat structures in Lake Chillisquaque, subject to approval by Talen Energy Supply, the PA Fish & Boat Commission, and PA DEP
 - MARC must apply for and receive a DEP GP-1 (Fish Habitat Enhancement Structures) permit before installation may proceed (no change since last meeting)
- o MARC is working with Girl Scout Gold Award candidate Hailey Exley to create and install new bluebird boxes, as well as related bluebird habitat restoration work
- Stoudt met on 10/23/22 with a Girl Scout Gold Award candidate to consider options for a possible bat habitat improvement project
- Because of continued MARC staffing challenges and the unavailability of several key volunteers, Stoudt is proposing to host only one (instead of two) Maple Sugaring Open House on Saturday, February 25, 2023
 - MARC will be unable to offer weekday field trips for schools and other groups
- In consultation with MARC's staff and after researching local comparable sites, Stoudt has reviewed and updated the Montour Preserve pavilion usage application form and fee structure for the 2023 season
 - All fees have been increased by \$25; fees were last updated in 2015

2023 BUDGET PACKET

STAFF DRAFT FOR BOARD CONSIDERATION REVISED 11/16/22



STOUDT 2022 / 2023 BUDGETING / STAFFING NOTES

- 1) Multiple ongoing global conflicts and political crises, public health concerns, increasing interest rates, and significant inflationary pressures continue to make accurate budgeting exceedingly difficult, particularly regarding projections for Montour County Hotel Tax revenues.
- 2) 2022 year-end Montour County Hotel Tax receipts will total \$163,433.13, exceeding the budget estimate of \$130,000. This better than expected revenue was a welcome bit of good news in an otherwise exceedingly challenging year. MARC's staff are conservatively budgeting \$150,000 in Montour County Hotel Tax revenues for 2023.
- 3) Inflation has increased the cost of nearly all supplies and most outsourced labor not bound by contracts, resulting in an across-the-board negative budget impact. Significant increases in electricity and fuel prices have been particulary noteworthy. Stoudt anticipates continued inflationary pressures into 2023 and beyond.
- 4) MARC continues to see a reduction in volunteer hours as compared to recent years, resulting in the need for MARC staff to perform more tasks. Year-to-date, volunteers have contributed 1,267 hours of volunteer labor at MARC sites and special events. In comparison, during the period of 2016 2022 (the period of time during which MARC has tracked annual volunteer hours), the mean average of volunteer hours was 1,871, with a maximum of 3,227 hours (2020) and a minimum of 1,267 (2022).
- 5) Visitation to the Montour Preserve has continued to rise steadily, particularly among school groups, business meetings, and summer camps. As of 11/12/22, Stoudt is projecting a year-end total visitation at the Montour Preserve of 110,000, representing a 10% increase over the prior year. Across all MARC-operated sites, Stoudt estimates a total annual visitation of roughly 200,000. This increased visitation results in additional costs for supplies and site maintenance, but has not resulted in any perceptible increase in donations.
- 6) Three of MARC's six employees (now eight) experienced signficant personal challenges during the summer months, resulting in severe staffing challenges for the organization. As of 11/12/22, Stoudt has worked 611 hours of overtime for the year, resulting in an increased labor cost of at least \$7,637. The hire of Julian Brehm and Valentina Shevchenko in August, as well as the return of Denny Piatt to regular scheduling, have resolved the difficulty.
- 7) An evaluation of MARC's compensation suggests MARC's Director is significantly undercompensated, but most other positions are appropriately compensated on an hourly pay rate basis. However, to retain or attract well-qualified candidates, both MARC's Director and Assistant Director positions should receive paid vacation and benefits. MARC's current funding does not allow this level of compensation and no such change is recommended for 2023.
- 8) MARC succeeded in retaining two major sponsors (Hawkins Chevrolet and Ski Valley) for the Dirty Grin Mountain Bike Festival, but both organizations had supported the event in the prior year. MARC secured only one organizational sponsor and five personal sponsors for the Montour Preserve 50th anniversary event. These two events were essentially revenue neutral for MARC. Unfortunately, MARC has failed to attract any new major sponsors for the organization's general operations or for other special events.
- 9) With the notable exception of donations made in memory of Larry Robertson and Byron Roth, MARC is seeing a significant decline in individual and organizational donations. Stoudt attributes this in large part to ongoing economic hardships and challenging conditions for individuals and organizations alike. This is unlikely to change in the short-term and has resulted in noteworthy budget cuts for 2023.
- 10) As has been previously noted, MARC continues to defer necessary maintenance projects and equipment purchases because of insufficient funds. Provided with MARC's draft 2023 budget is a summary of MARC's known deferred and unfunded budget items, totaling \$577,400. Underfunding of MARC's operations will become increasingly visible to park visitors in 2023 and beyond as critical infrastructure such as roads, parking lots, and buildings continue to deteriorate. Additionally, MARC's staff members have no choice but to continue using personal vehicles and equipment to complete tasks on MARC's behalf.
- 11) 2023 will be the fourth year of Geisinger's pledged five-year commitment of \$25,000 in annual general operating support. MARC cannot presume funding will continue beyond Geisinger's five-year pledge and must begin to plan accordingly for 2025 and beyond.
